### Role of the Health Team

Health team is a group of people working together for a common goal in order to provide preventive, promotive, curative, rehabilitative, restorative services to the individual, family & community.

### Characteristics of Effective Health Team

- ① Proper leadership & confidence in the leader.
- ② Clarity of health targets
- ③ Full knowledge of objectives among the health team.
- ④ High but achievable & measurable objectives
- ⑤ Clear knowledge of work & role.
- ⑥ Team should relate welfare & professional progress.
- ⑦ Members should be qualified enough to achieve objectives
- ⑧ clear definition of priorities

- ⑨ Cooperation & coordination among members
- ⑩ Resolves conflicts & problems by team problem solving techniques.
- ⑪ Having time table / schedule
- ⑫ Evaluation of results from time to time.

# Duties & Responsibilities of ANM / Female Health worker

## ① Maternal & Child Health

- ① Register & provide care to pregnant women throughout the period of pregnancy.
- ② Ensure all pregnant women get VDRL & HIV test done.
- ③ Conduct 50 per cent of deliveries in the assigned area.
- ④ Supervise Deliveries conducted by dais & assist in Need.
- ⑤ Assist MO & LHVs in conducting antenatal & postnatal clinics at sub-centres.

## Family Planning

- ① Utilize the information from the eligible couples of Child Register to the family planning programme.
- ② Spread message of family planning to the couples & motivate them.
- ③ Identify women leaders & help the health assistants to train them.

### 3) Medical Termination of Pregnancy

- o Identify the women requiring help for medical termination of pregnancy & refer to the nearest approved institutions.

### 4) Malnutrition

- o Identify the case of malnutrition among infants & young children (0-5 years)
- o Administer vitamin A solution as prescribed to children from 1-5 years.

### 5) Universal Immunisation Programme

Administer DPT vaccine, oral poliomyelitis vaccine, Measles vaccine & BCG vaccines to all infants & children.

Maintain Report of all eligible persons those vaccinated & follow up defaulters.

## 6) Diarrhoea Control Programme

- o Educate Mothers Regarding Home Management of diarrhoea with ORT.
- o Provide & Indent ORS

## 7) Dai Training

- o List Dais in the assigned area & involve them in Promoting family welfare.

## 8) Vital Events

- o Record Births & deaths occurring in the assigned area in the Birth & death Registers & Report to Health Workers.

## 9) Preventive Health Care

- Surveillance For unusually high, incidence of cases of diarrhoea, dysentery, fever, jaundice, diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, polio & other communicable Diseases & Notify the PHC.
